Content
Glencoe Speech is an introductory speech text aimed at high school students. The text covers a full range of topics, from different types of interpersonal communication to preparing and presenting speeches to debate and parliamentary procedure. This makes Glencoe Speech a good fit for any speech class and as a valuable resource in regular English classes. The tone of the text is friendly and engaging. The authors believe strongly that communication is a key skill for all people and have, therefore, developed the exercises and activities to address the various aspects of communication as well as how it relates to life at school, at work, and in relationships.

Student Experiences
Student experiences while using Glencoe Speech are broad. They learn about communication failures and their consequences and offer analyses as to what happens when communication breaks down. The text teaches students how to become more confident speakers; how to organize their thoughts; how to find information to support their thoughts, how to develop the necessary delivery skills; what is required for a successful job interview; and why working together with other people makes sense.

Assessment
Each section within the twenty-one chapters ends with a Section Review where students recall facts and think critically about the chapter's content. Students are given a collaborative activity in a feature called "Taking Charge" to demonstrate their knowledge of the information presented. At the end of each full chapter comes Review and Enrichment pages where assessment is divided into sections that include "Looking Back," "Speech Vocabulary," "General Vocabulary," "To Remember," "To Do," "To Talk About," "To Write About," and "Related Speech Topics." The Teacher Resource Box has chapter booklets that contain evaluation forms and chapter tests for the twenty-one chapters in the student edition.

Organization
The six units are organized around broad themes such as interpersonal communication. Each of the twenty-one chapters within the units begins with an overview of the goals of the chapter and ends with a Review and Enrichment section, composed of vocabulary, comprehension, crucial review, and critical thinking questions. Sections within each chapter highlight one of the goals of the chapter and close with different types of review questions that cover the material in that section.

STUDENT EXERCISES CONTAIN A WIDE VARIETY OF INQUIRY TASKS WHICH USE THE INTERNET, THE LIBRARY RESOURCES, AND THE COMMUNITY IN A WIDE RANGE OF WAYS. WHILE THE BOOK INTENDS THAT STUDENTS FORMALLY SPEAK ONLY 4 TIMES, IT PROVIDES FOR MANY INFORMAL SPEAKING OPPORTUNITIES WHICH MAY ALSO INCLUDE VISUALS OR MULTIMEDIA.

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FORMAT

TEXT INCLUDES SUFFICIENT THEORY TO HELP STUDENT UNDERSTANDING OF THE DISCIPLINE, WHILE STILL PROVIDING ADEQUATE PRACTICE WITH SPEAKING TO PROVIDE A WELL-ROUNDED BASE FOR FURTHER STUDY.

VOCABULARY ARE IDENTIFIED AT THE BEGINNING OF THE CHAPTER. TEACHER RESOURCES CONTAIN PRACTICE PAGES FOR VOCABULARY FOR EACH CHAPTER. TESTS INCLUDE QUESTIONS ON TERMS FOR THE CHAPTER.
