Recommendations: Classic Shakespeare shortened somewhat with added stage directions and explanations. Useful for students with little or no Shakespeare or "difficult reading" experience. Play is true to original and deletions are well-hid, so as to not interfere with the reading or storyline. Could be easily used in place of full text versions for either production or classroom reading.
