





Explain to the student that they will be reading a passage and will then answer a few questions about the passage. Present the student with Reading 3 B The Pancake Party (Reading 3 B The Pancake Party Picture Board may be presented as a support for the student). Have the student read, or read to the student, the passage Reading 3 B The Pancake Party.

a. They all ate pancakes.	The student recognizes that pancakes were eaten at the end of the story however does not identify that Mouse did not share with the other characters.	
b. No one ate pancakes.	The student recognizes that some characters did not get to eat pancakes at the end of the story however does not identify that Mouse did eat pancakes.	
c. Only Mouse ate pancakes. (Correct)	The student recognizes and correctly identifies that only Mouse ate pancakes at the end of the story.




