The Career Work Experience Certification (CWEC) is one of four components of the Kentucky Alternate Assessment. The CWEC was developed for students with significant cognitive disabilities in an alternate course of study and working toward the alternative high school diploma. The CWEC is designed to provide a career readiness measure within the Transition Readiness indicator of Kentucky's accountability system. A district may determine a student participating in the alternate assessment has attained the CWEC by completing the following checklist items. If Yes is selected for all answers to Items 1-6, the district may award the student a certificate to recognize the attainment of the CWEC.

Multi-Year Course of Study

Transition planning, beginning at age 14 or 8th grade, whichever comes first, includes the development of the multi-year course of study. For students working toward achievement of career readiness status within the Transition Readiness indicator of Kentucky's accountability system, the multi-year course of study includes the four elective courses specific to the attainment of the CWEC.

<u>Item 1:</u> The multi-year course of study in the student's IEPs or Conference Summary Reports, beginning at age 14 or 8th grade to year of high school exit, include the four courses leading to the CWEC in the following prerequisite order:

- -Developing Career Options
- -Developing Leadership Skills
- -Experience in Workplace Principles
- -Individualized Career Work Experience

Career Readiness is reported to KDE's Office of Career and Technical Education (OCTE), in a typical assessment year. Therefore personnel from OCTE will audit supporting documentation during monitoring or review visits for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs. At the time of the audit the district will be asked to provide a copy of the student transcript, generated from Infinite Campus (IC). A comparison between the transcript and the multi- year course of study will substantiate whether the CWEC courses planned were completed.

<u>Item 2:</u> The student transcript from IC includes the four courses leading to the CWEC, in prerequisite order.
