TEDS Training

We've passed the testing window deadline, so we can finally breathe—well, not exactly. There's still work to be done, and we need access to TEDS to get it done. Stop me if you think you've heard this before, but let's make sure we'll have access when we need it.

Have you checked your training date lately? Remember, you must complete training every two years. Log into TEDS and check the upper right-hand corner to see your last training date. Are you getting close to the deadline? Upcoming training dates are posted on the TEDS website every Monday following the currently posted session.

Also, keep in mind the Best Practice for TEDS access: At least two people in every school should have full access to TEDS. If no one is able to enter data, the school or district could potentially lose future funding.

EOP and TRACK Test Tickets

From November to February 10 test ticket records were updated daily providing the opportunity to verify the accuracy of that data. We hope it was not a neglected opportunity. Here are some important things to know about EOP and TRACK test tickets:

The window for verifying students eligible for EOP and TRACK test tickets has closed. Remember, you still must verify that you received all test tickets. The test ticket report will no longer update.

Data entry is the responsibility of the staff at each school. If the student is unable to take an EOP assessment due to inaccurate data entry, don't stop the music. If those students are not seniors and they take a course next year (the 2025-2026 school year), their data can be updated at that time, and they would then be eligible to take an EOP assessment in the spring of 2026. If they are seniors, they are eligible to take an industry certification assessment.

Important Process Update for 4-course Sequence


The CTE Program of Studies provides a guideline for the required courses for each pathway. It is to be used similarly to a college course catalog. Schools are required to provide the opportunity for a student to become a concentrator and, ultimately, a completer.

Perkins V requires that each pathway offer a sequence of four or more non-duplicated earned technical credits to be considered a pathway. Schools have been asked to provide a basic 4-course sequence in TEDS to ensure they are offering valid pathways. Moving forward, individual schools will be allowed, within guidelines, to go your own way. HOWEVER, the requirements won't stop. To ensure clean and accurate data, each school must do the following:

- Ensure they are offering appropriate courses in accordance with the current year Program of Studies.
- Ensure courses offered will allow a student to complete the pathway based on the best practice courses listed for each pathway in the Program of Studies, meaning
 - ♦ If a listing shows "and", both courses must be taken.
 - ♦ If a listing shows "or", only one course may be counted toward concentrator status, completer status or for postsecondary readiness at both state and federal (Perkins) levels.
- Follow the Co-op regulations as noted in 705 KAR 4:041, Work-based learning program standards, which states A student must fit one of these categories:
 - Be enrolled in a course included within the student's chosen career pathway within the same academic year,
 - Be a completer in the career pathway they are co-oping in by the end of their junior year; or
 - ♦ Be enrolled in an approved pre-apprenticeship program.
- Note that Co-op and/or dual credit cannot be the only 4th course option available to students as all are not able to engage in co-op or dual credit.
- Students may only be enrolled in TEDS for pathways that are offered at the school they are enrolled in.
 - ♦ If the courses are taken at an ATC, the ATC is responsible for TEDS enrollment and data upkeep
 - If the courses are taken at a KCTCS campus, the KCTS campus is responsible for TEDS enrollment and data upkeep

With these changes, it is important to note that all schools will be responsible for providing proof of offered courses on demand and during any monitoring process which should include the enrollment years of any student record under review.

How Clean Is Your Data?

The end of the year is coming. Is your data in order? You know you can be on top of your data. Things might get a little tight, but don't stop believin'. You've got this! Verify your data before it's too late. As you work, consider these points:

- When you enroll students in pathways,
 - ♦ The student should know they are in that pathway (no surprises)
 - ♦ The correct credit hours must be posted. Then, **credit hours must be updated whenever they change on the official transcript** (e.g., end of semester/trimester).
- When a student earns an industry certification for their chosen pathway, it should be properly entered in TEDS as soon as the information is received from the instructor and in the same school year it is earned.
- Once a student meets the definition of concentrator, that should be properly noted in IC and **imported** into TEDS when it happens.
- NO DATA HOSTAGES. Clean data is happy data.
