Summary of Discussion: The priorities that had the most votes: 1-Equitable resources across districts; 2-Educating teachers and parents on identification and recommendations for students showing leadership characteristics; and 3-Equitable funding for all socioeconomic/geographic groups/districts.

England made a motion that SACGTE accept these as the three top priorities. Seconded by Carrie Ballinger.

There was discussion over gifted education funding mechanisms and the possibility of making recommendations regarding regulations.

Members discussed changing the second priority to focus not just on leadership, but on other under-identified gifted areas that are harder to quantitatively identify.

Members discussed ways to develop and advocate for an accessible shared resource space.

Motion to accept the three top priorities carried.

Agenda Item: Gifted Education Update

Kathie Anderson, Gifted Education Consultant, Office of Special Education and Early Learning

Summary of Discussion: Kathie Anderson shared current Office of Special Education and Early Learning (OSEEL) North Star Priorities. She provided the group with the current vacancies on the council: Parents of gifted and talented (GT) students, Visual and Performing Arts and Postsecondary. There was a special meeting last summer to get feedback on the Gifted Student Service Plan (GSSP). The new plan auto-populates to save districts time and comments can be added. The GSSP transfers with students and reports can be generated to show which students are in the Parent Portal in Infinite Campus (IC). Feedback from districts has been very positive. There are new resources available for GT coordinator on the GT Coordinator OneStop such as New GT Coordinators Training, Beginning of the Year Training, Special Considerations and Twice-Exceptional Students. Some of the communications available from OSEEL are the weekly New You Can Use email and the quarterly OSEEL Newsletter. Gifted funding was increased in the 2022 legislative session and a new formula was developed for allocation of funds. Information about GT allocations are available on the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) State Grants webpage.

Hannah England thanked Anderson for all the time and effort that went into the new GSSP. England stated she has also heard a lot of positive feedback from other school districts.

Agenda Item: Kentucky Association for Gifted Education (KAGE) Update

Kimberly Nettleton, KAGE Liaison

Summary of Discussion: Kim Nettleton also praised the new GSSP and how wonderful it has been. There is a virtual KAGE conference on Oct. 18, 2023. Information is available on the KAGE website. The annual conference is Feb. 26-27, 2024. Conference proposals can be made online until Sept. 29, 2023. Nettleton shared that a group will be presenting to the Joint Committee on Education on Oct. 17, 2023, at 11 a.m. to ask for more funding for gifted education. Anyone who can attend to show support is welcome and encouraged.
