

## Considerations for Use of Narrative Techniques in Other Modes of Writing—Grade 8

Clarity and Coherence	Uses narrative strategically in other modes of writing.
	Utilizes effective narrative technique.
	Produces clear and coherent writing in which the development, organization and style are appropriate to task, purpose and audience.
Support	Develops narrative with well-chosen details.
	Develops experiences, events and/or characters by using narrative techniques, such as:  • dialogue;  • pacing;  • description; and  • reflection.
Organization	Utilizes well-structured narrative sequences for an intended purpose.
	Engages the reader by:     setting up a problem;     setting up a situation or observation;     establishing a point of view; and     introducing a narrator and/or characters.
	Creates a smooth progression of experiences or events.
	Uses a variety of transitions to convey sequence, signal shifts from one time frame or setting to another and show the relationships among experiences and events.
	Provides a conclusion that connects the narrative's relevance to the intended purpose of the writing.
Language/ Conventions	Uses precise words and phrases, relevant descriptive details and sensory language to capture the action and convey experiences and events.
