## **Nonresident Student Enrollment**

## CRITERIA FOR APPROVAL

The Superintendent will approve the request for enrollment of nonresident students in the local schools, provided all of the following conditions are met:

- 1. When the payment, or arrangement for payment, of tuition as established by the Board is made in advance to the Superintendent and is acceptable to the Superintendent;
- 2. The student has not been expelled from the school in which he was last enrolled;
- 3. The student is not under suspension from the school in which he is or was enrolled;
- 4. The student does not have an unacceptable history of disciplinary problems;
- 5. Class sizes and grade level organizational pattern will allow enrollment of the student;
- 6. No district vehicles will be required to leave the school district to pick up the student;
- 7. The student entering grades 4-12 has a minimum cumulative G.P.A. of 3.0 and has received at least a 3.0 G.P.A. for the semester prior to enrollment;
- 8. The enrollment is made within ten (10) days of the beginning of the semester:
- 9. The student has less than seven (7) days of unexcused absence during the previous year and/or less than five (5) days of unexcused absence during the semester prior to enrollment.

The Superintendent may provide exemptions to these criteria for enrollment.

## APPEAL PROCESS

When the decision of the Superintendent is not satisfactory, an appeal may be made to the Board of Education. The decision of the Board is final.
