Nonresident Student Admissions

Application Process

An application must be made to the Superintendent or designee from July 1, 2022 and July 15, 2022.

Applications after the original 2022 year will be accepted from April 15th to April 30th each spring for the next year.

Accompanying the application, must be a transcript or other information showing good academic standing. A report of student's behavior or conduct, including but not limiting to physical violence and or disciplinary actions taken. A statement of good attendance or record.

- The expectation of good academic standing should reflect a C or 2.0 GPA.
- The expectation of good behavior should reflect zero suspensions school or bus related.
- The expectation of good attendance should reflect no more than 6 unexcused events.

District Capacity Guidelines

Nonresident pupils will only be admitted when they can be assigned to classes or programs where enrollment is below district capacity guidelines.

District Capacity Guidelines will be based on 80% of district staffing policy allocations of staff for all grade levels and programs. (see district staffing policy)

Enrollment Guidelines

Nonresident pupils may be admitted to the District's schools in accordance with Board policy. 09.12

Nonresident students that were enrolled in Pulaski County Schools prior to June 30, 2022 will be grandfathered for enrollment unless the student fails to meet district standards of academics, attendance, and behavior.

Nonresident students that reside in the land locked area of Wayne County, separated by Lake Cumberland, will be allowed to enroll unless the student fails to meet district standards of academics, attendance, and behavior.

Siblings of nonresident students will not be guaranteed admission. Siblings must apply for nonresident admission.

Nonresident students accepted into the Pulaski County School District must reapply before April 30 of each school year.

Nonresident students will enroll in the Elementary, Middle, High School that is associated with the geographical direction in which their home district lies according to the attendance zones.

Attendance Zones

Lincoln - Eubank; Rockcastle - Shopville/Northern Elementary; Laurel - Shopville; McCreary - Burnside;

Wayne – Burnside; Russell – Nancy; Casey – Nancy/Eubank

Nonresident students from the Somerset Independent school district with residence west of US 27 have the option to attend Oak Hill Elementary and its feeder schools. Those with residence north of East Mt. Vernon Street have the option of Pulaski Elementary School and its feeder schools. Those with residence South of East Mt. Vernon street have the option of Southern Elementary.

Nonresident students from Science Hill Independent School district with residence west of US 27 have the option to attend Eubank Elementary School. Those with residence east of US 27 have the option of Northern Elementary School.

Transportation

Transportation will not be provided for nonresident students.

Athletics

Any student who transfers enrollment from a district of residence to a nonresident district under KRS 157.350(4)(b), shall be ineligible to participate in interscholastic athletics for one calendar year from the date of the transfer.

Tuition

A yearly tuition of \$1500.00 will be required upon immediate notification of nonresident approval and must be received by the first day of the school year. This tuition is nonrefundable.

Nonresident students that reside in the land locked area of Wayne County, separated by Lake Cumberland will be exempt from this fee.

The determination of nonresident student admission shall be made by the Superintendent or Designee.
