8 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 156.070(5), 7 C.F.R. 210.8(b)(1), 220.11(b), 225.9(d)(6),

9 226.10(e)

10 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 156.070(5) requires the Kentucky
11 Board of Education to promulgate administrative regulations governing the operation of
12 programs within the Department of Education. 7 C.F.R. 210.8(b)(1), 220.11(b),
13 225.9(d)(6), and 226.10(e) provides the Department of Education with the authority to
14 establish deadlines for claim reimbursement for federal nutrition programs. This
15 administrative regulation establishes the claims deadlines for these programs.

16 Section 1. Definitions. (1) "Online Reporting System" means the Web-based computer
17 application used for claims processing.

18 (2) "Program Operator[~~Sponsor~~]" means an entity approved to participate in a nutrition
19 program that is administered by the Division of School and Community Nutrition (SCN).

20 Section 2. Submission of Monthly Claims. To be entitled to reimbursement, each
21 participating program operator[~~sponsor~~] shall submit a monthly Claim for Reimbursement

1 to SCN. The Claim for Reimbursement ~~[form used]~~ shall be submitted in the online
2 reporting system or by U.S. mail ~~[the form corresponding to the type of program operated~~
3 ~~by the sponsor, and shall be one (1) of the following forms:~~

4 ~~(1) Non-Profit Programs Report and Claim for Reimbursement;~~

5 ~~(2) For-Profit Programs Report and Claim for Reimbursement;~~

6 ~~(3) Adult Programs Report and Claim for Reimbursement;~~

10 Section 3. Submission Timeframes. (1) A final Claim for Reimbursement shall be
11 postmarked or submitted through the online reporting system to SCN no later than 11:59
12 p.m. Eastern time on the 15th of the month following the month covered by the claim to
13 be considered a timely filing.

14 (2) Corrected claims~~[Claims]~~ shall be ~~[not]~~ postmarked or submitted through ~~[by]~~ the
15 online reporting system to SCN no later than 11:59 p.m. Eastern time on the 30th of the
16 month following the month covered by the claim to ~~[claims deadline shall not]~~ be
17 considered a timely ~~[claim]~~ filing ~~[by SCN]~~.

18 (3) A request for a waiver from the deadline established in subsection (1) or (2) of this
19 administrative regulation may be submitted in writing to the SCN~~[SCN's]~~ division director
20 with the reason for the late claim filing clearly specified.

21 ~~[(3) Corrected claims shall be submitted on or before the 30th of the month following the~~
22 ~~month covered by the claim to be considered a timely filing and shall be accompanied by~~
23 ~~a completed Corrective Action Plan. The Corrective Action Plan submitted shall be the~~

1 plan corresponding to the type of program operated by the sponsor, and shall be one (1)

10 (4) Claims submitted after the deadline established in subsection (1) or (2) of this

13 Section 4. Claim Verification. The claim shall be signed by an authorized official of the
14 program operator[sponsor] if submitted by U.S. Mail.

(1) Provide a brief summary of:

(a) What this administrative regulation does: This administrative regulation establishes deadlines for claim reimbursement for federal nutrition programs operated by the Kentucky Department of Education.

(b) The necessity of this administrative regulation: 7 C.F.R. 210.8(b)(1), 220.11(b), 225.9(d)(6), and 226.10(e) provide the Kentucky Department of Education with the authority to establish deadlines for claim reimbursement for federal nutrition programs. This administrative regulation establishes the claims deadlines for these programs.

(c) How this administrative regulation conforms to the content of the authorizing statutes: KRS 156.070(5) requires the Kentucky Board of Education to promulgate administrative regulations governing the operation of programs within the Kentucky Department of Education. 7 C.F.R. 210.8(b)(1), 220.11(b), 225.9(d)(6), and 226.10(e) provides the Kentucky Department of Education with the authority to establish deadlines for claim reimbursement for federal nutrition programs. This administrative regulation establishes the claims deadlines for these programs.

(d) How this administrative regulation currently assists or will assist in the effective administration of the statutes: This administrative regulation establishes deadlines for claim reimbursement for federal nutrition programs operated by the Kentucky Department of Education. 7 C.F.R. 210.8(b)(1), 220.11(b), 225.9(d)(6), and 226.10(e) provide the Kentucky Department of Education with the authority to establish deadlines for claim reimbursement for federal nutrition programs and KRS 156.070(5) requires the Kentucky Board of Education to promulgate administrative regulations governing the operation of programs within the Kentucky Department of Education.

(2) If this is an amendment to an existing administrative regulation, provide a brief summary of:

(a) How the amendment will change this existing administrative regulation: The regulation amendment changes the reference from sponsor to program operator, deletes forms incorporated by reference, updates the requirement that claims be signed by an authorized official to only those claims submitted by U.S. mail, and changes when a corrective action plan must be submitted.

(b) The necessity of the amendment to this administrative regulation: The regulation

amendment is necessary to update the definition section to provide clarity and align with federal law; delete forms that are not necessary; update the requirement for claim verification signatures to be only those claims submitted by U.S. mail; and update when a corrective action plan must be submitted.

(c) How the amendment conforms to the content of the authorizing statutes: KRS 156.070(5) requires the Kentucky Board of Education to promulgate administrative regulations governing the operation of programs within the Kentucky Department of Education. 7 C.F.R. 210.8(b)(1), 220.11(b), 225.9(d)(6), and 226.10(e) provide the Kentucky Department of Education with the authority to establish deadlines for claim reimbursement for federal nutrition programs. The regulation amendment updates requirements related to submitting claim reimbursements.

(d) How the amendment will assist in the effective administration of the statutes: The regulation amendment updates requirements related to submitting claim reimbursements.

(3) Does this administrative regulation or amendment implement legislation from the previous five years? This legislation does not implement state legislation from the previous five years.

(4) List the type and number of individuals, businesses, organizations, or state and local governments affected by this administrative regulation: Entities, including school districts, approved to participate in a federal nutrition program administered by the Kentucky Department of Education.

(b) In complying with this administrative regulation or amendment, how much will it cost each of the entities identified in question (4): There are no anticipated costs to participating entities.

(c) As a result of compliance, what benefits will accrue to the entities identified in question (4): Participating entities will be eligible for reimbursement through the federal nutrition program for submitted claims.

(6) Provide an estimate of how much it will cost the administrative body to implement this administrative regulation:

(a) Initially: There will be minimal cost to the Kentucky Department of Education.

(b) On a continuing basis: The ongoing cost to the Kentucky Department of Education will be minimal.

(7) What is the source of the funding to be used for the implementation and enforcement of this administrative regulation or this amendment: General funds and federal funds.

(8) Provide an assessment of whether an increase in fees or funding will be necessary to implement this administrative regulation, if new, or by the change if it is an amendment: None.
