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Server Updates and SQL Audit

Infinite Campus servers will be upgraded to **SQL Server 2022** and migrated to a new data center between **December 19 – January 2**. Please keep in mind the key dates provided below, the services impacted, and plan to complete actions required to help ensure a smooth transition. NOTE: Jefferson Co. and Lincoln Co. have already completed this migration.

Beginning Dec. 19 at 6 p.m. ET through Dec. 21, 6 p.m. ET updates will be made to State Edition, Reporting Warehouse, and SQL Server Reporting Services (SSRS). During this time the following services will be impacted:

- Student Locator and Staff Location will be unavailable.
- o Records transfer requests and student state ID requests will queue until the State Edition is restored.
- KDE Reports will display an error message if run.

Beginning Dec. 22 through Jan. 2, the KTS Data Exchange will pause data refreshes until all district migrations are complete. The KECS LEAD nightly updates will fail for districts receiving a new URL; those districts will show no KECS LEAD data until the migrations are fully complete.

Districts will be migrated individually. See <u>Data Center Move Schedule</u> for your district's outage window. During the district's migration the Infinite Campus application, Parent Portal and Student Portal will be unavailable. OneRoster connections and scheduled data extracts will be suspended to third-party systems.

The server migration requires district action. Infinite Campus created a case titled "SQL 2022" for each district outlining the required actions within Campus and other systems. Districts with SQL access accounts have received a case titled "Access Account Audit" with a response deadline. Timely action is essential to ensure account functionality post-update.

Data Visualization (Tableau) Update: Chronic Absenteeism

A new visualization aimed at providing users with a three-year trendline on chronic absenteeism (CA), is now available in the Data Visualization suite of dashboards. Infinite Campus users with user rights to the Tableau Data Visualization environment, are able to access the new <u>CA Trends</u> visualization in the <u>KY FTE Attendance workbook</u>. CA Trends displays an aggregate count of students who are reported as chronically absent and allows for filtering by demographic groups. Other updates include:

- The KY Attendance visualizations have been moved to a separate workbook (KY Attendance).
- Accessing a district or school now requires active selection before users see data.
- The Data Visualization (Tableau) environment will be impacted by the Infinite Campus server migration. Access will be unavailable beginning Dec. 15 and may extend through Jan. 9.

TEDS Import Data Validation Process

TEDS import data is now validated based on the SSID, Date of Birth (DOB), First Name and Last Name. If there is a mismatch, users will see the following message Error: The specified SSID and DOB combination does not match the SSID and DOB stored on the existing TEDS student Demographic record. Verify DOB.

USERS SHOULD <u>TEST THE IMPORT</u> EARLY AND OFTEN UNTIL PREPARED TO COMPLETE AN OFFICIAL IMPORT. An error will occur If the data in TEDS does not match the attempted import.

If this occurs, verify the following:

- Verify the SSID
- Use documentation (other than Infinite Campus) to verify DOB and name.
- Correct any errors discovered in Infinite Campus, then create new export files from Infinite Campus and TEST the import into TEDS.
- If data is verified and there is still an error on import, contact kdectedataservices@education.ky.gov.

An import can be tested at any time. Please do not finalize the import until the data is free of errors. If an import is finalized with identified errors, those records will not be imported into TEDS.

NEW Early Literacy and Early Numeracy Screener Reports in Campus

Campus release 2543, deployed on Nov. 12, 2025, included new reports for reviewing Early Literacy and Early Numeracy universal screeners and Early Literacy diagnostics in Infinite Campus. NOTE: Users must be granted access by local KSIS administrator before gaining access to the reports.

Early Literacy Reports

The Early Literacy Universal Screener report allows users to review data for KDE Early Literacy Universal Screeners. The Early Literacy Diagnostic report allows users to review data for KDE Early Literacy Diagnostics. These reports include early literacy assessment data for school, district and state level educators and Read to Achieve (RTA) grant administrators. The reports will help monitor uploading formative assessment data for RTA schools, which is a requirement of the RTA grant and are available for any school or district choosing to voluntarily upload formative assessment data to the state level KDE Early Literacy test structures.

Early Numeracy Reports

The <u>Early Numeracy Universal Screener</u> report allows users to review data for KDE Early Numeracy Universal Screeners. The purpose of this report is to provide early numeracy universal screener data for school, district and state level educators and Mathematics Achievement Fund (MAF) grant administrators. This data will help monitor uploading formative assessment data for MAF schools, which is a requirement of the MAF grant and are available for any school or district choosing to voluntarily upload formative assessment data to the state level KDE Early Numeracy test structures.

Reading Improvement Plan Custom Report Now Available

Aligning Course Content and Educator Credentials




To ensure compliance and avoid 'Out-of-Field' errors and warning messages in LEAD, it's essential to verify that the content of any assigned course aligns with the educator's current professional credentials. You can perform this verification on the Kentucky Educator Credentialing System (KECS) website.

First, locate the teacher's Profile page on KECS, and in the left-hand column, click on 'Credentials' to find the

educator's current credentials, including the credential code(s) listed in the first column. Scroll down on the page to find the Credential Permissions for Active Credentials table. This includes the Core Contents that the educator has active permissions for, the job function, the student population that is included, and the grade range.

Next, navigate to the 'General' section on the left menu and select 'Course Search' or go to the <u>Public Course Search on KECS</u> to search for the courses that align.






Choose the correct school year (e.g., 2025-2026), then click 'Advanced Search' located next to the search button. In the LEAD Content Areas box, enter one of the educator's content permissions and select 'Search.' The resulting list will show all courses that the teacher is clear to teach for that content area.

Alternatively, you can also search for aligned courses by noting the educator's credential code(s) and inputting it into the Certifications box.

Foster Care and Student Records Transfer Report

Districts are encouraged to periodically generate the <u>Student Record Transfer Report</u> in Infinite Campus to monitor compliance with <u>KRS 199.802 legislative expectations</u> (as amended by <u>House Bill 312</u> (2020), which created specific time requirements for requesting and releasing records for students in foster care. Records must immediately be requested by the new school and released by the prior school on the working day that the request is received. District personnel can use this report to monitor student records transfer requests for students enrolling in or withdrawing from other Kentucky school districts during the school year.

It is important to keep in mind the timeframes to request records transfer, as well as the time it takes to release records. The report can be generated for all schools or a single school within the district. A foster indicator is included in the report output to help monitor compliance. Suggested uses include:

- Generate a detailed and/or aggregate report to identify enrollments with no records requests initiated.
- Identify withdrawals with records requested that have not been released.
- Identify withdrawals for which a records request has not been made, and follow-up is needed.
- Monitor timeliness of records transfer requests/releases to identify potential need for more training or guidance.

Ensuring students are enrolled and records are requested and transferred promptly helps to ensure that students in foster care are on the path to success and receive all appropriate services in their new school as quickly as possible. The report is not intended for data cleanup, as the records transfer data cannot be changed; however, the information in the report can help to identify issues to improve processes.

If student records have not been requested from the student's new school, district staff are encouraged to use the student locator to find where the student is enrolled and contact the school to determine why records have not yet been requested. System administrators should assign tool rights to the school district staff responsible for records transfer or management of that work.
