District Safe Schools Administrators,

The [Behavior Data Standards](#) have been updated for the 2024-2025 school year. The major changes from the previous standards document are outlined below:

- Restraint and Seclusion data steward is now [Tania Sharp](#)
- Update to Section A for recommendation and link to guidance for [behavior set-up for PBIS tracking](#) for districts who participate in Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) on setting up Infinite Campus behavior to ensure consistent reporting and filter options through KSIS Data Visualizations – Tableau, Behavior Dashboard and Views.
- Guidance to ensure data collection requirements are met for [House Bill 142](#) implementation. The bill enacts additional requirements for student behavior events involving drug type use for Alternative Nicotine Product, Tobacco Product, Vapor Product.

IC data entry requirements and updates for House Bill 142 are outlined below.

Users who select a behavior event of Drug or Tobacco Use, Possession or Distribution are required to select an option for the Drug Type drop list. The list will contain each of the following related to the bill (reference Section (4)(b)):

- Alternative Nicotine Products (this new option will be available with IC's July 2024 release)
- Nicotine Vapor Products
- Non-Nicotine Vapor Products
- Tobacco/Nicotine Product
- THC Electronic Vapor Product

When a behavior event involving the above Drug Types, the bill requires a resolution for the first incident that the school counselor or other school-based mental health services provider shall provide to the parent/guardian and the student evidence-based, age-appropriate nicotine cessation information to include but not limited to materials, programs, and referrals for treatment (reference section (4)(b)(1)). KDE recommends districts create a new local behavior resolution to track this

resolution for these specific behavior events. Reference Section A of the [Behavior Data Standards](#) and specific steps below to complete this task.

If a behavior event involving drug or tobacco results in a medical intervention, users must select the already existing indicator named *Medical Services Provided* in the Participant Details section of the Behavior Management Tool (reference Section (8)(b)). Output of this indication for drug or tobacco violations will be added as output to the Safe Schools report in a future IC release.
