KDE will host a 30-minute online training session Friday, May 5, 10 a.m. ET/9 a.m. CT to assist districts in setting up Campus Messenger to promote the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). Jennifer Winburn will go through the step-by-step process to setup Campus Messenger to easily provide ACP information and the eligibility letter families need to complete the application process. Those participating can setup Messenger for their school during the training. The training will be recorded and posted on the <u>KDE ACP</u> <u>Webpage</u> and the <u>KSIS Training webpage</u>. You must register in advance to receive the TEAMS link needed to join the training.

Now is a great time to let families know that they can save on their home or mobile internet connectivity and devices. Help your students connect and continue learning over the summer months and be ready for the fall semester. Qualifying households can save up to \$30/month on new or existing internet service and receive a one-time discount up to \$100 for the purchase of a tablet, laptop, or desktop computer. Parents or guardians simply need an eligibility letter from the school to complete the federal application. All families with students receiving free- or reduced-priced lunch are automatically eligible, including all students who attend a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school, regardless of income. Over 80% of Kentucky households with a student enrolled in public schools qualify for a

monthly ACP discount on their home internet service; however, less than 40% of those eligible have enrolled into the program.
