Year at a Glance: Suggested Tasks for December

- Monitor implementation of schoolwide parent and family engagement activities to ensure they meet the intent and purpose of the Title I parent and family engagement program.
 - As a reminder, entertainment/social activities such as award ceremonies and holiday parties should not be paid for with Title I, Part A funds.
- Ensure the methodology regarding supplement, not supplant is on file at the district office, if required for your district. Please note, some districts are exempt from the supplement, not supplant methodology. Please see the <u>U.S. Department of Education information</u> (USED) document (question 26, p.20) for information on exemptions.
 - Additional information on supplement, not supplant is available in KDE's <u>Title I</u> <u>Supplement not Supplant Information document</u>.



Preparing for Tentative Census Data

- Tentative census poverty data and corresponding hold-harmless rates should be released in the coming months.
- KDE issues this data to districts for planning purposes for the 2026-2027 school year.
 - Please note that any numbers provided are tentative and subject to change.
- Data can be used to calculate an estimate of your 2026-2027 Title
 I, Part A allocation.



Formula Children

- Children ages 5-17
 - Residing in the geographic boundaries of the school district from families below the poverty level identified by census data compiled by the U.S. Department of Commerce.
 - In licensed facilities for foster children updated annually by the Kentucky Cabinet for Families and Children and reported to the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services. Specifically, this refers to children living in foster care for at least 30 consecutive days, at least one day of which was in the month of October.
 - In local institutions for neglected children reported annually by KDE to USED. This is based on the number of children who reside in an institution for neglected children for at least 30 consecutive days, at least one day of which was in the month of October.



What's the Difference?

Census poverty percentage

- Gathered by Census Bureau.
- Estimates based on a statistical model that incorporates information from multiple sources.
- Used by USED to determine district allocations

District poverty percentage

- Gathered by the district.
- Actual numbers based on direct certification (DC), free and reduced-price lunch (FRPL), household income forms.
 - Varies based on method of calculation.
- Used by districts to rank and serve schools.



Comparison

District Name	Final SY 2024-2025 Census Poverty Percentage	District Poverty Percentage from FY2025 Application
District A	15.05%	55.79%
District B	33.88%	78.39%
District C	29.18%	67.56%
District D	19.39%	62.38%
District E	2.39%	8.46%
District F	11.39%	44.04%



Hold Harmless

- "Rock bottom" dollar amount a district eligible for Title I funds may receive in any fiscal year, provided adequate funding is appropriated by Congress.
- Variable
- Based on previous year's allocation and census poverty percentage.

Census Poverty Percentage	Hold Harmless Rate	
30% or greater	95%	
Between 15% and 30%	90%	
Below 15%	85%



District F	2,123	9,068	23.41%	90%
