Safe and Healthy Students

Purpose: Improve school conditions for student learning.

Grant Requirements

- Districts that receive \$30,000 or more must conduct a Comprehensive Needs Assessment and select activities based on the results of that assessment.
- With an allocation over \$30,000, districts must spend at least 20% of their total allocation to support safe and healthy students.
- Funds must be supplemental and cannot supplant state or local funds or be used to support activities that are required by state or local law.

Comprehensive Needs Assessment

- Determine district needs based upon local data
- Identify school, student population or overall district needs
- Decide supplemental activities that will address identified needs
- Document, document, document!

Allowable Expense Examples

- Salaries for individuals providing supplemental supports
- Contracts with local agencies or outside organizations
- Professional learning opportunities or trainings
 - Cannot be used for required district trainings or the required 24 hours of professional learning
- Supplemental instructional resources

Evaluating Program for Effectiveness

- Evaluate program periodically during the year to determine if it's being effective in addressing the identified needs.
- Adjust program implementation to ensure effectiveness.
- Document evaluation process.
