

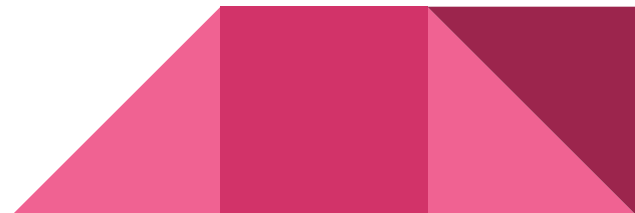

VPA Identification 704 KAR 3:285 Section 3


Students must be identified through a evidence of a performance. This must include one of the following:

- auditions
- letters of recommendations
- product or portfolio assessment by specialist t or professional artis t.

Evidence may also include:

- Awards or critiques of performance
 - Portfolio of visual or performing arts ability
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Services 704 KAR 3:285 Section 6

- There must be multiple (minimum of two) services for students in each category a student is identified
 - Services must be provided during the regular school day with the exception of academic competitions and extracurricular offerings
 - Grouping for instructional purposes and multiple service delivery must be used
 - Grouping should be based on student interests, abilities and needs, including social emotional
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What is Flipgrid?

Flipgrid is a free platform that allows teachers to post prompts and lets students respond to the prompts with short videos. Students can respond to just the teacher or can respond to each other's videos as well.

Teachers and students can access Flipgrid from any computer or device with a webcam.

Flipgrid's website is www.flipgrid.com.

To make it even easier to use for teachers to use, Flipgrid is available as an "External Tool" in Canvas and can be shared with Google Classroom.

When you first access the site, it will ask you to create an Educator Account. Login using your teacher email (if you are a Google district, login using your Google credentials). The site will ask you a few questions about your school and how you will use the program.

Flipgrid does not use your information for spam!!



Flipgrid Tabs - The Power of Flipgrid!!

1. **Discussion** - Your educator dashboard and home page.
2. **Discovery** - A searchable database of Topics created by other educators that you can copy and use for your classes!
 - a. Click “Help” and search for “Integration Docs” to find a wealth of Topics for specific content areas!!!
3. **Activity** - Shows the recent activity in all of your Topics and your personal “Achievements” within Flipgrid.
4. **Mixtapes** - Here is where you can create video collections from student responses within your Topics!
5. **Shorts** - Flipgrid’s version of Screencastify! Here is where you can create instructional videos (or any video) for your students!
6. **GridPals** - Connect with other Flipgrid users!



Flipgrid Basics

Discussion - This is your dashboard screen. It shows all of your groups and the main tabs/navigation tools of the site.

Groups - This is where you organize your topics. Groups can be individual classes or can be units of study...your choice! Add **Co-Pilots** (co-teachers/collaborators)!

Topics - These are the individual assignments within Flipgrid that are assigned to specific Groups. Inside the Topics are your students' video responses.

Responses - These are your student submissions.



Step 1: Create a Group

Click “Add a Group”. Groups can be individual units or individual courses .

- a) You will need to create a name for your Group (Course Name or Unit/ Assignment Name)
- b) You can change the “Join Code” to anything you want! Flipgrid will let you know if it is available to use.
- c) Add Students - Use Student Emails, rather than Student Names. This allows for email sync with Flipgrid.
 - i) In the blue box, make sure your type the entire student email address after the @ symbol for your district. For example: @stu.fayette.kyschools.us
- d) You can duplicate Topics from other Groups or skip that step.
- e) “Share the Group” - this is a code you can use to share this Group with individuals.
 - i) Hover over the option icons to see choices.
 - ii) You are not required to share at this time!


Step 2: Create a Topic (Part 1)

1. Click “Add a Topic”. Topics are the individual assignments.
 - a. Add a title for your topic.
 - b. Add the narrative for your prompt.
 - c. Set “Recording Time” for the length of the video responses. Recording times are available from 15 seconds up to 10 minutes in length.
 - d. Option: You can select Closed Captions!
 - e. Topic Moderation
 - i. Off: Only the teacher sees the responses
 - ii. On: Students can see each other’s responses
 - f. Add Media Links, if appropriate
 - g. Add “More Options” (see next slide)
2. Click “Create Topic”!



Step 2: Create a Topic (Part 2- More Options)

Click on “More Options” for additional topic setup options .

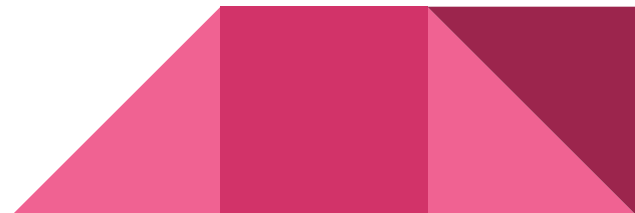
- a. Topic Attachments - You can attach up to 9 external links to your topics
 - b. Topic Status
 - i. Active - Topic is available for responses
 - ii. Frozen - Topic is no longer accepting responses
 - iii. Hidden - No one but the teacher can see the Topic
 - c. Scheduled Dates - You can determine when the topic will be “available” for students to respond.
 - d. Topic Features - Set teacher email notifications, allow downloading and sharing, or followers.
 - e. Video Features - Lots of neat features here to customize the videos
 - f. Feedback - Allows teacher to custom create a rubric for the topic!
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Creating a Video in Flipgrid

Getting Started - Students (Quote from Flipgrid.com)

“When you're in the Flipgrid camera, you can record a video in these 4 easy steps:

- 1. Tap to record** - Tap the record button on the bottom to start. Add fun stickers, filters, text, and more. Tap the arrow on the bottom right to advance.
- 2. Review your video** - Trim, split, rearrange, or add more. Tap the arrow in the bottom right to advance.
- 3. Take a selfie** - The selfie will be the cover image for your video. Tap the arrow in the bottom right to advance.
- 4. Submit your video** - Edit your name, add a title, or attach a link. Then submit!”




Flipgrid Integrates with Canvas and Google Classroom!

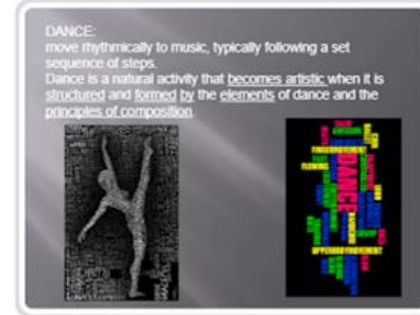


